## 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Issue Carbon & Climate Law Review (CCLR) 3/2026

**Submission Deadline: 30th of June 2026**

The *Carbon & Climate Law Review* (CCLR) invites submissions for a special anniversary issue marking twenty years since the journal's first publication in September 2007.

Founded as the first journal dedicated exclusively to the legal dimensions of climate change, CCLR has accompanied - and helped shape - the emergence of climate law as a distinct field of scholarship and practice. Over the past two decades, climate law has moved from the periphery of legal debate to the center of national policymaking, international cooperation, corporate governance, financial regulation, trade, human rights litigation, and administrative and constitutional law. This anniversary issue provides an opportunity to reflect critically on that evolution and to explore the directions climate law is likely to take in the years ahead.

### SCOPE AND THEMES

We invite original research articles addressing the past, present, or future of climate law, including (but not limited to):

- the evolution of international climate law from Kyoto to Paris and into the current crisis of multilateralism;
- the growing role of domestic and international courts, litigation, and human and constitutional rights in climate governance;
- climate law and economic regulation, including carbon pricing, markets, and fiscal instruments;
- interactions between climate law and trade, investment, competition, and industrial policy;
- corporate climate governance, disclosure, fiduciary duties, and financial regulation;
- the role of subnational, transnational, and private actors in climate norm-setting;
- equity, justice, and differentiation in climate law;
- methodological developments and interdisciplinary approaches in climate law scholarship.

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## SUBMISSION

Submissions need not be retrospective in nature; forward-looking and critical contributions that engage with emerging legal challenges and institutional innovations are particularly welcome.

Authors are welcome to contact the editors informally to discuss proposals prior to submission.

The editors look forward to receiving submissions that reflect the richness, diversity, and continuing evolution of climate law as a field of legal inquiry and practice.
