**Article title** – clear and descriptive, reflecting the legal or policy issue addressed.

## 1. Executive Summary / Key Takeaways

Include **3–5 bullet points** (1–2 lines each) summarizing your article's main arguments, findings, or implications. These will appear at the start of the article and may be used in newsletters and social media

## 2. Article Structure & Table of Contents

Use **clear section headings** (H2, H3) reflecting key issues for readability and SEO.

**Table of Contents (optional):** Provide a list of headings if possible; otherwise we'll generate one from your structure.

*Headings may be adapted by editors for consistency.*

### 3. Short Introduction (150–200 words) – Optional

Brief introduction covering topic, relevance, and main argument. Useful for promotional purposes even if not published in full article.

### 4. Keywords (3–5 terms)

List **3–5 keywords** covering main themes (legal instruments, frameworks, policy areas, cases, institutions) for online discoverability.

### 5. Article Length

**800–1,500 words** recommended. Shorter commentary pieces also welcome.

### 6. Citations and References

Keep references **concise**. Use in-text citations or hyperlinks rather than extensive footnotes. Clearly identify key cases, legislation, or reports where relevant.

### 7. Author Bio & Professional Links

**Biography (50–80 words):** Position, affiliation, expertise.

**Links (optional but recommended):**

- LinkedIn profile
- ORCID iD
- Institutional/personal webpage
- Google Scholar or publications page

Example:

- *American stakeholders are criticising the lack of openness of the European arms market, especially since the European Commission has been pushing for European strategic autonomy*
- *However, this EU strategy does not prevent European states from acquiring American capabilities, the Foreign Military Sales (FMS) programme being the preferred approach, with a surge of notifications since 2022*

- *This choice reflects economic advantages, since using the FMS reduces transaction costs and uncertainty, particularly for countries that do not have a strong and comprehensive procurement organisation*
- *For the European Union, the stake consists not in opening more of the market, but in reducing internal transaction costs and increasing the understanding of European offerings for a real level playing field with American competition*
